PhD CoLab Initiative

The PhD CoLab is a pilot initiative from G+PS that will offer awards and guidance to support PhD students and faculty from different disciplines to codevelop new knowledge and/or applications to address complex questions or problems.

There are two categories of awards available:

- "Large" (up to \$100K) three or more students, possibly in multi-year collaborative projects
- "Small" (up to \$30K) two or three students, possibly in shorter-term collaborative projects

Funds can be used to support student stipends, research expenses and/or dissemination/mobilization activities. Teams should have at least two faculty members and two PhD students, drawing from two academic disciplines.
